Summer camp options provide families with a respite break from caregiving responsibilities while giving children opportunities to form relationships with other children and adults, access to recreation and enrichment activities, opportunities to learn new skills, and a chance to socialize with peers.

Keep in mind that there may be additional summer programs in your community that are not listed. Be sure to check your local newspapers for information on day camps and summer recreational programs in your area. Network with parent organizations such as parent to parent groups and parent resource centers in the public schools. Contact local community agencies providing recreation and leisure programs. Check with disability agencies such as community services boards and associations for retarded citizens (ARCs). For children with special health care needs, contact departments of health as well as local community health organizations.
