History

In 1997, school health stakeholders convened to form a school nurse partnership steering committee to coordinate school nursing continuing education activities. Stakeholders included the Virginia Departments of Health and Education, and the Partnership for People with Disabilities at Virginia Commonwealth University. The School Nurse Institute Partnership (SNIP) was created from this steering committee in 1998.

Mission
